## What is MCTEN?

MCTEN is a Division of Research and Innovation program that started in 2020 to support inclusive excellence in early career faculty. MCTEN focuses on transformative interventions to support all SDSU faculty in their research, scholarship and creative activities.

MCTEN has three primary activities: building intentional community, creating productive spaces, and supporting inclusive policies. These activities are all designed to support SDSU faculty in their journey of academic excellence.

## **MCTEN** activities

**Dedicated Writing Space (DWS)** a weekly online space that provides faculty with a community of practice to support research and scholarly activity.

Facilitated Mentoring MCTEN faculty have access to a list of potential sponsors connecting and in this model, faculty have autonomy to identify who and what they need.

Mixers MCTEN organizes informal mixers to meet, mingle and connect

Chew on This! MCTEN's lunch and learn series that provides faculty opportunities for professional development. Topics include: setting up a lab, broader impacts, impactful graphics, cross-cutting conversations, mentoring, leadership.

Writing retreats Hosted bi-annual events that bring together faculty to write, connect, and inspire.


## What's new with MCTEN in AY23-24?

MCTEN's new name reflects a new focus on supporting community, research and scholarship for all SDSU faculty across all ranks. This year, MCTEN supported 200+ faculty from all 8 Colleges.

At the core of the MCTEN approach is the intentional design, formation and curation of activities that leverage strength of community, peer-to-peer learning, and support, buoyed by senior faculty allies as sponsors and mentors.


